MANCHESTER, NH – (April 30, 2024) The League of Women Voters of the United States, **the League of Women Voters of New Hampshire**, and several individual New Hampshire voters have filed a motion for preliminary injunction in the U.S. District Court of New Hampshire asking the court to stop the defendants from producing, generating, or distributing **Al-generated** robocalls, text messages or any form of spoofed communication impersonating any person, without that person's express consent.

ST LOUIS, MO — (April 18, 2024) **The League of Women Voters of Iowa** and One Iowa filed an amicus brief in the US Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit asking the court to uphold a lower court's injunction on an Iowa **ban on certain books in school libraries**.

ASIAN AMERICAN & PACIFIC ISLANDER HERITAGE MONTH

In May we honor Asian-Americans and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islanders. It is also Mental Health Awareness Month and Women's Health Care Month. May was either named for the Roman goddess Maia, the nurse, or the Roman goddess of fertility, Bona Dea, whose festival was held in May.

The entire month of May honors all

military men and women who have died in military service. It is called Honor Your Hometown Fallen Hero month. The last Monday of May is designated as Memorial Day. It is reserved for military men and women who lost their lives fighting for our country.



May 1 is May Day, which is a European festival that marks the beginning of summer and is also known as Labor Day in many countries throughout the world. May Day traditions include dancing around a Maypole, crowning a May Queen, and giving flowers to loved ones. May 5 is the famous Cinco de Mayo Day which is a celebration of the Mexican Army's victory over France under Napoleon III at Puebla during the French/Mexican War. However, it is not Mexico's Independence Day which is September 16. May 12 is Mother's Day in the U.S., which is usually celebrated on the second Sunday of the month. In the United States, it was started by Anna Jarvis, who organized the first Mother's Day service in 1907 at Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church in West Virginia. By 1911 all U. S. states celebrated it and in 1914 Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation designating the second Sunday in May as a national holiday to honor all mothers. May 21 is Multicultural Diversity Day and May 22 is Harvey Milk day. Milk was a gay rights activist who was assassinated in 1978.

<u>The Last Emperor of Mexico</u> by Edward Shawcross is the story of European hubris and imperialist aspirations clashing with revolutionary fervor and the old world breaking with the new. It is the story of a young Austrian Archduke Maxmillian, and a Belgian princess, Carlota, who were encouraged by Napoleon III to become the emperor and empress of Mexico, and were abandoned by the French Army when they withdrew.

<u>Memorializing Motherhood</u> by Katharine Lane Antolini is a book about why Anna Jarvis promoted a day to recognize "mothers" and then why she opposed the commercialization of Mother's Day by Hallmark and other businesses. <u>"Mother's Day"</u> is a romantic/comedy movie on HBO starring Julia Roberts, Jennifer Aniston and Kate Hudson with Jason Sudeikis about celebrating Mother's Day.

Update on The Foundation for Enhancing Communities, Patricia L. Murray Grant

We have distributed displays of translated materials (Guide to Voting) in 6 languages along with the English versions of Guide to Voting and Your Choice, Your Voice to the following YMCAs: West Shore, East Shore, Camp Curtin, Friendship, and Northern Dauphin County, and to multiple libraries in Cumberland and Dauphin County.

Legislative Update

We are following legislation proposed by Rep. Scott Conklin of Centre County, which aims to help counties provide quicker election returns. According to Rep. Conklin: Under current law, precanvassing of absentee and mail-in ballots cannot begin until 7 a.m. on Election Day. "Pre-canvass" is defined in the Election Code as the inspection and opening of all envelopes containing official absentee ballots or mail-in ballots, the removal of such ballots from the envelopes and the counting, computing, and tallying of the votes reflected on the ballots. It does not include the recording or publishing of the votes reflected on the ballots.

With more and more people voting by mail-in ballot, tabulating ballots and releasing election results is taking county boards of elections much longer. In House State Government Committee hearings we heard from numerous experts, including county election officials from both parties, who testified that our state should allow counties to pre-canvass mail and absentee ballots much earlier than the morning of the election. Many believe that delays in tabulating election returns can lead to voter suspicion and unfounded conspiracies.

Allowing counties to pre-canvass mail ballots would significantly expedite the availability of election results. Legislative action is needed to give counties the time they need to address the enormous volume of mail-in ballots expected to be cast in future elections, especially the upcoming 2024 presidential election. We need to ensure that Pennsylvania does not become a national embarrassment on Election Day.

At the request of county commissioners, this legislation would also make the deadline to apply by mail for an absentee ballot or mail-in ballot earlier. Additionally, this legislation will increase transparency for viewing the pre-canvass and canvass of ballots. Finally, the bill would require the county boards to notify electors who had minor defects with ballots so that they can be corrected prior to the election.

This legislation passed the Pennsylvania House on May 1, but its future in the Senate is uncertain as members of the Senate insist on voter ID requirements being added.
